This is the twelfth time that I have written the Senior Pastor's report for our annual report. I never cease to be amazed at the goodness of God that is covered in these reports. Within you will read about lives that are being progressively given over to Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord and about how people are journeying with the mission of God in the hands of ordinary people.

At Crossway we choose to report back to the members the impact of the ministry rather than the process of the ministry. It makes for a distinct report. So rather than having each department give a reflection on their annual activities we choose to report back the collective impact of what all of these initiatives have delivered. This type of commitment to impact for the glory of God is one of Crossway's hallmarks. We have chosen to unwed ourselves from our ministry vehicles and we have committed ourselves to impact in the discipleship journey. This impact is ultimately measured in people's lives.

You may ask why we choose to measure the things that we measure. It is simple; we believe that the decisions that are measured within reflect the most catalytic decisions that a person makes in their discipleship journey. For each of these steps we have sought to 'uncomplicate' things. We have sought to remove the hurdles and encourage people to simply take profound steps towards being a disciple of Jesus. They are not made in a linear fashion but they are made by those who choose to surrender their lives to Jesus. We call the measure of these decisions 'stream data' because people are streaming towards being disciples of Jesus. These are in contrast to some other important information that we call 'pool data' which includes how many people attend, how much money is given and what we are doing with our facilities. These are important to monitor but they do not tell us as much about the discipleship journey.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank every #TeamCrossway servant. By the grace of God your efforts make all of this impact possible. To the Board, I give my thanks to God for your spiritual maturity and dedication. Governance at Crossway is one of the hidden gems that allows us to focus on the main thing. To each of the dedicated staff members who repeatedly go above and beyond, I thank God for you. To the unsung heroes who have prayed, worshipped, sacrificed and blessed people in the name of Jesus, I thank God for every one of you.

Let's keep our eyes on Jesus as we move towards an exciting and challenging 2019 and continue to build a discipling culture at Crossway and beyond.

# BAPTISMS

Yiu was experiencing some personal challenges. On a trip to Hong Kong, he came across a Christian and by the end of the conversation he knew something was missing from his life. When he returned to Australia, he was introduced to a couple from Crossway. The couple maintained contact and eventually Yiu came to his first Cantonese church service at Crossway. He attended the Cantonese Family Gospel Fellowship (similar to Alpha) and put his faith in Jesus. This is his testimony:

"It all happened in less than three months, from the first Crossway service I ever attended to the day of my baptism. I attended 'Discover the Bible' and 'Alpha' classes. Both myself and some of my friends might wonder about the haste maybe one can find a clue from this photo taken while I was sharing a testimony on stage. I was amazed when I first saw it and its message was clear (for those who can't see it, the cross goes right through me).

To start with, I am a sinner. That's a burden I did not wish to carry alone. I knew only Jesus Christ would be able and willing to help me. Reading the Bible, worshipping and accepting Jesus have helped me build a relationship with the Lord. Zoli is a young Hungarian gypsy man now living in London. He used to be a drug dealer and part of a gang. Zoli is the brother of Suzy, who is the niece of Zsuzsi, who is the sister of Judit. We are seeing the gospel spread through discipleship that continues in and through families and goes even beyond borders. This is the story of one of the miracles that God is doing.

I met with Judit in 2014. I discipled and baptized her and knew she was a 'person of peace' in her family and community. She started to disciple her sister Zsuzsi and then baptized her.

Even though Judit had a break from fellowship for various reasons, Zsuzsi grew stronger and stronger. Last year her neice, Suzy, came from London for her Dad's funeral and stayed with Zsuzsi for a week. That's when Suzy met the Lord and she was baptized and began to be discipled by her aunt, Zsuzsi.

Suzy went back to England and spread the news of Jesus amongst her family and friends. Two months ago, her brother Zoli visited her in London and he gave his life to Jesus too. Suzy baptized him and started to disciple him. Now Zoli is doing a DBM with two of his friends!

Suzy also started to disciple her sister, who lives in Hungary as a Buddhist. Zsuzsi disciples three other people, too. They read the Bible together and discover who God is, looking for the personal truth in

which they will commit to obey. They are accountable to each other and share with others. They support each other and their community in their needs. They love Jesus and their lives are being transformed as they read the Bible and obey His word. Their passion for reaching the lost amongst their community is growing more and more!

Zsuzsi's life is already an example to many gypsy people around her. Her heart is to find people of peace amongst gypsy drug users and prostitutes and disciple them.

Zsuzsi says, "I thought I missed all of my opportunities in life for studying and helping people. I didn't have any sense of a good life. But as I found my Jesus I found a second chance to live a life which counts and not just for me but for others too. I found my purpose in discipling people and that's given me joy. I could not easily read or write and didn't have any qualifications because when I was young I was told that I had dyslexia and so I had no hope. But with my Jesus everything is possible. In one year I will complete the training for my second trade. I have raised my daughter in the faith and we not only fluently read the Bible, but help others to do that too."

We are continually amazed at how Jesus prepares the way for people to meet Him. We have been particularly reminded of this as we see new and ongoing work flourish, both here in Australia and around the world.

Simon and his team work in Central India, which has a population of over 120 million people. While the sheer number of people in the harvest is enormous, it would seem God's vision for this region is just as big.

Together with Simon, we are witnessing the birth of a disciple-making movement in Central India. In 2018, over a thousand people became disciples, hundreds were baptised and Discovery Bible Method groups have grown into churches across the entire region. We know that leadership in such a fastmoving environment is vital and so plans

Simon and his family have also faced personal crisis as their first child, Jessica, was born prematurely and required intensive care. Thanks to God's healing hand and the prayers of an international community, Jessica made it through and is now growing.

We continue to pray for, support and equip Simon, his family and his team. We cannot wait to see what God is going to do to reach the Harvest in Central India in the coming year.

# DISCIPLES THAT MULTIPLY

We first heard about 'reading the Bible with friends' during a Sunday sermon by Pastor Dale.

The challenge was that we did not know how to best go about doing these Bible reading sessions - until we attended the workshops conducted by Dale and Edi at Crossway in 2018. What we learnt was extremely helpful. Now, by applying the simple techniques taught we each have our own regular get-togethers with others, reading and talking about the Bible in a friendly and fun way.


In building a discipleship culture in the church where I pastor I have now started two huddles and am thoroughly enjoying growing people in their own discipleship journey.



Behind the outward facade of Melbourne's leafy eastern suburbs there is great need in our community. Thankfully, Jesus is greater. The LifeCare team were able to show his love through thoughtfulness and caring to make a significant difference in the lives of many.

The number of people we supported in 2018 set new records across our services. We supported more people with professional Christian counselling and psychology. The LifeCare Women's Centre went from strength to strength, effectively delivering the "Courage To Heal: Domestic Violence Support Program" for single mothers, with ten women successfully graduating.

Clients struggling with financial issues were helped back onto their feet by the Financial Care team. More food parcels were distributed than ever before. COACH mentors reached record numbers, walking alongside adults, youth and kids.

Through our community meals program, more isolated and lonely people were able to connect into a caring community.

The time, effort, prayers and generosity from each and every supporter has enabled us to do so much to meet the needs, in turn helping so many people who were in tough places to flourish!

When Shane was referred to the COACH program, he and his father were facing imminent homelessness as their rental home was being sold. Their stress was exacerbated by Shane's struggle with depression, anxiety and suicidality. His family were desperate to help him but did not know how.

"I didn't care about anything, I didn't care what happened. I had already given up," says Shane. "I was so consumed by my social anxiety and stammering I just didn't want to talk to anyone."

Shane was matched with a COACH Mentor, Pete. Pete learned that Shane had social anxiety exacerbated by a significant stutter. The anxiety had cost him jobs, relationships, academic achievement, and his health, and left him with despair, depression and hopelessness. Shane's primary coping strategy was to isolate himself, binge eat, sleep during the day and play computer games during the night. In his hopelessness, Shane said he did not care what happened to him, but he was willing to engage with COACH for the sake of his father.

Pete says, "Shane looked and spoke like I imagine he must have felt - defeated, dishevelled and disengaged. I really just wanted to do what I could to help and encourage him." Pete accompanied Shane and his father to the local housing service provider and his support and advocacy helped them to secure temporary housing, thereby avoiding becoming homeless. Over the course

of many meetings with Pete, Shane became more open to accessing other supports, including counselling and employment services. Shane was able to secure long-term shared accommodation and find short-term employment, and his counsellor was able to offer strategies to manage his anxiety and depression.

These days Shane is like a new person. He lives in an apartment with a friend he met at his anxiety support group. He has completed his diploma in Community Services and is employed as a Disability Support Worker. He is fit and healthy, he attends the gym and has lost heaps of weight, gaining confidence. He no longer has a stutter and with the help of his doctors has come off all medication. He has healthy relationships with his friends and family, is attending a local church, and is now mentoring a young person with COACH.

"Shane is one of my favourite people in the world to spend time with," says Pete. "His passion for life is such an encouragement to me. Journeying with him and seeing the radical transformation in his life has been amazing."
