You Promised



2022 was another amazing year as we journeyed our way through the pandemic years. Thankfully, Melbourne entered the post-lockdown phase of dealing with covid and for the first time since 2019 the broader ministries of Crossway were able to operate without the hinderance of government restrictions. Subsequently, the impact of the mission increased

In 2020 we saw 95 people put their trust in Jesus Christ for the first time. In 2021 that jumped to 165. In 2022 we saw 313 people put their trust in Jesus for the first time. For this impact I praise God and thank all of the people of Crossway who give their lives as disciples of Jesus in helping others come to know Him. Similarly, in 2020 65 people were baptised, in 2021 that jumped to 95, and in 2022 it jumped again to 127 people.

For all of the different things we measure, these two metrics tell me whether we are actually making disciples of Jesus. For all of the good that is done through the broader ministry, without new people coming to know Jesus it would be less than what it could be for the glory of God. So, thank you to all involved.

There has been an incredible resilience demonstrated throughout the pandemic. With the various challenges that have been thrown our way, by the grace of God the family of Crossway stepped up to the challenge. This has been real

in prayer, in finance, in initiative amongst those in need, in fact in all things people have pressed through this historically challenging period for the glory of God. As I prepare this report this has only amplified further into 2023. So, to every one of you who has prayed, served, stewarded the gospel and given your lives to those in need, thank you.

We continue to look beyond ourselves. Two new campuses will be opened in 2023. More international workers are being commissioned and an increasing number of churches are involved with initiatives like Building a Discipling Culture, Empowered Faith Communities and COACH. Through these initiatives we have worked and are working with roughly 3.5% of all of the churches in the nation and across 15 denominations.

It is important for us to collectively thank our Board who operate for the better part unseen and who are a hidden jewel of Crossway and its effective operations. In addition, I thank the over 1500 Team Crossway members who serve through the most disparate spheres. Your efforts, empowered by the Holy Spirit, are the driving engine of the broader ministry, and your efforts are not in vain.

We collectively note that great days are ahead of us for the glory of God. Let's give ourselves fully to Him and His purposes as we continue our journey. "Let's give ourselves fully to

Missional Communities

JACK & LILY

Starting in 2010 from Crossway Mandarin congregation at Burwood East, "The Rock" missional community grew to become several groups united by a shared intention to connect with seekers. Today the communities are based in Brighton and Clayton South.

Each of the groups had its own characteristics and grew in their unique way. The Clayton South group focused on nurturing and strengthening believers through relationship and character building. A Forest Hill group focused on reaching young professionals and ran Mandarin Alpha, with many coming to faith as a result. A Brighton-based group emphasised care of the sick and friendship evangelism through Mandarin-speaking networks.

In 2021 when Crossway Brighton was announced, members of the Brighton group were filled with joy and praised God. With much prayer, in 2022 they formed the core team which became Crossway Brighton's Mandarin congregation. The first Brighton Mandarin Alpha also began at that time and three seekers came to Christ. Today, the Mandarin service has grown to 40-50 regular worshippers. The community also runs weekly outreaches through Mandarin Alpha and a dance group connecting seekers from the local community.

We give thanks and praise to the Lord for His guidance and using His servants to build His kingdom.




South East

Missions

What do you do when you find an elderly person struggling with life? Would you create a Facebook post to share their plight? Would you tweet of the injustice faced by many? Would you be indifferent and do nothing at all? When Kiah, Crossway international worker in Chiang Rai, Thailand, heard that the home of a dear old lady was crumbling around her, she took action. This widower had no children to care for her and even her extended family were absent.

Pooling some quickly-raised meagre funds, Kiah took a small group of Thai handymen from the city to the mountainous region to repair things and replace that which could not be fixed. What made it more urgent was the coming monsoons. It can get really wet and uncomfortable if the roof and walls of your shelter have more holes than Swiss cheese.

There are 85 families in that village with plenty of brokenness, unemployment and substance abuse issues. Kiah, through a grant, was able to distribute much needed food resources to alleviate the pressure on families struggling to survive.

Praxeis

The team in Hungary have been trying for many years to connect to Ukraine; however, they continued to face barriers, including the COVID restrictions over the last couple of years. While the outbreak of war in the country has been devastating, God has brought Ukraine to Hungary.

The mass exodus of thousands of people from Ukraine since earlier this year has included many Hungarian gypsy families who have fled their home villages near the border with Hungary. These families want to go back to Ukraine but are waiting for the war to end.

Since the beginning of the war, the Praxeis team has been intentionally offering practical help to many gypsies fleeing Ukraine. They have organised accommodation, visas, food, medicine, hygiene items and toys for the children.

During the Hungarian summer months, the team have also been serving these displaced families through what they call 'Love Projects'. Over 100 days, the team visited houses and communities of gypsy people in Hungary and Ukraine, feeding over 1000 people. They delivered emergency food parcels and offered to pray and encourage the sick and vulnerable.

As they did this, many people of peace were found, with invitations extended to the Praxeis team to visit again, even back in their hometowns and villages of Ukraine after the war.

Working through the connections of two key leaders, the team are intentionally reaching out spiritually as they identify many families who are open to Jesus. Five Discovery Groups have started with the groups saying they want to take 'this teaching' back to their villages after the war.

As a result, there has been a move of God with over 60 baptisms at one event! Now movement training has commenced with a group of Ukrainian gypsy leaders. Movement has begun.

Building a Discipling Culture

"I've been able to grow through the BDC process and it's given me confidence to act" I've found that with BDC I've been able to take the principles around culture building and implement them in the workplace, as well as in the church.

It's far more than just culture building. Some of the BDC principles are about cultural change and some of them are church principles. I can apply them straight into my workplace and I'm seeing them bear actual fruit. From a personal point of view, I've been able to grow through the BDC process and it's given me confidence to act at certain times.

On a recent occasion I fervently prayed that I wanted people to see God in me. Five days later, I was at a work function at a restaurant and we had someone there who we'd been working with for two years but had only met over zoom. We met him for the first time that day. He came to me during dinner and said he needed to talk to me about something. He told me about one of his best friends who had just committed suicide. I was able to pray with him and speak the love of God into him and to share with him that it's not an unforgivable sin. It was a very special moment, and it came just five days after praying that prayer. The impact of that and other stories I could share too has been very significant.

After attending the seminar, 'How to Disciple Your Friend Towards Faith in Jesus', I had doubts about whether "the harvest is plenteous". My circle of friends is limited to only a few, and I didn't think I knew a Person of Peace.

Two days after the seminar I went fishing on Mordialloc pier. While waiting for the fish to come, I saw an elderly gent who I had met a week earlier at the same pier. This time, we had a deeper conversation. We chatted about travel and the beauty of nature, and I asked him of his work before he retired: masseur and Chinese medicine. I told him about my constant pain in the left knee. Surprisingly, he squatted down and squeezed my knee in several spots to try to determine where the pain was. The teaching from the seminar was coming true right in front of my eyes - here was a Person of Peace massaging my knee!

In our conversation, he mentioned God and His goodness in creation. Immediately I asked whether he was a Christian, and he said "not yet and not baptised." He had read Karl Marx, Buddhism, the Bible and many religious books in search of the truth. He concluded that Christianity was the most appealing of them all. He said he wished to have a Chinese-English Bible, which I said I'd try to get for him. I also asked whether he would like to attend a church service and his answer was yes! We went on to read the Bible together using the Discovery Bible Method, and later my new brother was baptised at Crossway. To God be the glory! Jesus is very much in control and truly the harvest is plenteous!



LifeCare

Like many of LifeCare's Community Pantry patrons, Michelle is a resourceful single mum who is dedicated to supporting her children. During covid lockdowns she was diagnosed with a brain tumour. She shared her news with the pantry team and we began walking alongside her. Later in the year, Michelle found herself in a crisis. Her car required urgent repairs and she needed it desperately, particularly to attend medical appointments. Being unable to work, she could not afford repairs. We were able to help Michelle access a reliable mechanic who repaired her car.

Michelle shared, "We'd be lost without LifeCare. There's been times when we haven't been able to eat. We don't have a lot of family. You have basically become extended family to us."

Alongside food support, the team creates a friendly culture where relationships are built, people are encouraged, patrons are referred to other LifeCare services and there's opportunities to join the team and get involved. "I'm not alone. I know I'm in good hands with LifeCare", said Michelle.

Darren* initially became involved with an Empowered Faith Community through the COACH Community Mentoring program. His mentor, Robert, encouraged Darren to use his passion for cooking to benefit others by working in the kitchen, where he prepared meals alongside Jill.

Although Jill and Darren come from very different social spaces, they became great mates, developing a bond that became loving and caring. Jill, a grandmother, had raised her family while operating successful restaurant businesses. Darren, having left school before he turned 15 years old, had learned to cook in prison. While working together in the early stages of their relationship, Darren would often regale Jill with colourful stories of his past and present situations, not necessarily to amuse himself but in part to see how Jill would respond. Jill realised that she needed to listen and be non-judgemental, exercising patience and perseverance.

Over time, as their relationship grew and trust was formed and earned, Darren came to rely on Jill for spiritual wisdom and guidance. Jill had earned the right over a significant period of time to ask challenging, reflective questions of Darren. Darren's positive regard and sense of love for Jill was such that he phoned her for Mother's Day to thank her for her contribution to his life. Darren describes Jill as a role model. Jill exemplifies the need to be highly relational and low in challenge in the values gap, recognising that transformation is incremental and a long journey. These are great qualities in a Spiritual Parent in Empowered Faith Communities. Our hope is that with Spiritual Parents building trusting and safe relationships, honesty and vulnerability can form, leading to transformation.


